## SPRING SPORTS REVIEW

THE END OF the school year saw the Tigers bring home a state title and state runner-up finish in lacrosse, while our other programs found continued success. The boys lax team finished the season with a 17-3 record and won the state title in double overtime. They tied the game with eight seconds to go in regulation by a goal by Plain Dealer Player of the Year Tristan Subel (Jack Subel '84). This is the sixth state title for Chagrin and second for Boys Lax (2003). We do have other prominent alumni boys starting on the squad from Charlie Winovich (Barry Winovich '84), Plain Dealer Goalie of the Year Jackson Markley (Lisa Howard Markley '83), & Pierce Fricke (Laura Wilharm Fricke '83). The girls lax team had a 16-4 record and finished as state runners-up with a 9-8 loss to Columbus Academy.

Alumni children were also well represented on the girl's team with Hailey & Kendal Baker (Jeff '79 & Jackie Venning Baker '80), Kirsten Hendricks (Kelly Shuster Hendricks '83), and Shea Salyers (Mike Salyers '90). The ladies were also represented by senior Kelsey Owen, who for the the past two seasons has been an All-American and Plain Dealer Player of the Year. Senior Molly Hopkins was selected the Plain Dealer Goalie of the Year. The boys track team came in fourth place at CVCs and sixth at districts. The girls track team won the CVC meet and were district runners up. Junior Joey Bistritz (Rich '77 & Martha Beattie Bistritz '77) was runner-up in the mile run at the State Track & Field Meet. Of the seven others on the podium, Joey is the only one that will be returning next year. Last fall Joey won the state title in the cross country meet. Both the boys and girls 4 by 800 relay teams made the podium with fourth place finishes. On the girls relay team is Allie Dustin (Jim Dustin '83). The baseball team went 22-8 this season and at one point had an eight game winning streak. They came in second place in the CVC and lost a very exciting district semi final game vs Tallmadge. The softball team returned to the diamond for the first time in two years. The team had impressive wins over Newbury and St. Martin DePores and all the players on this year's roster return next year. With a tough schedule, the boy's tennis team went 8-7 and had a doubles team advance to districts. 🤽

If I am truly an alien that was sent to Chagrin Falls, Ohio, from some far away planet, it could not have been designed more perfectly. The name and the town itself are unique and very special. It is the only town named Chagrin Falls in the entire world.

The setting, which is picturesque and spectacular, begins with the river. The Chagrin River, which flows into Lake Erie, runs under North Main Street smack dab through the middle of the village.

A French explorer named Sequin is credited with discovering Chagrin Falls. But Native Americans had set up camps in dense woods and fishing the river and streams hundreds of years before Europeans set foot in the area.

A falls lies on both sides of North Main Street. Northeast of town, near the paper mill sat a third falls. The Popcorn Shop overlooks the most scenic and biagest falls in town. The Popcorn Shop and the paper mill are old landmarks in Chagrin Falls.

North of town on North Main Street, overlooking the village stands Grove Hill. The hill, which is very steep, was probably carved during the ice age.

I moved around town at a much faster rate than most kids. I remember living in six different houses in the village of Chagrin Falls, and I was told I lived in several more. Three of the houses sat a short distance from the top of Grove Hill. When I was six and seven years old, I lived with my grandmother in one of the hill top homes.

Everyone that has visited this little town has probably been to the Popcorn Shop, known for its ice cream, frozen custards, and

popcorn. It has always been an attraction for townspeople and for tourists who drive to the village for an old-fashioned small town visit. It takes them away from their faster-paced lives in more heavily populated areas. Since all the old buildings in Chagrin have been restored to preserve their originality, a visit to the village is a step back in time.

But the Popcorn Shop that Mr. and Mrs. Kewish owned back in the day didn't have my favorite food-hamburgers. The Standard Drugstore, Speice's Drugstore, and Frizzells Restaurant were places that kids and adults went to for hamburgers, ice cream and other treats. My grandma took me to Speice's for ice cream. Two giant scoops cost 10 cents, and a single scoop of ice cream was five cents.

Grandma didn't drive a car. but she didn't need one. Evervwhere she lived was in or near the village, close to stores. And her husband, Bill Kelley, walked to and from his night shift job at the paper mill.

As much as I liked chocolate ice cream at Speice's Drugstore, nothing could surpass hamburgers cooked on the grill, in most places, right in front of your eyes. Burgers were 15 cents in the 1940s and a whopping 25 cents when the 1950s rolled around. All the drug stores had a grill for cooking burgers and hot doas, but the best burgers in town came from Brimm's Beer Garden.

Grandma rarely had enough money for burgers and fries, but when she did, we went to Brimm's.

Growing up in Chagrin, I wasn't aware how special that little town really was. It was just my hometown-nothing more, nothing less. I didn't even realize what a bargain the movie theater was. There weren't many movie houses anywhere in the 1940s and 1950s that only charged 14 cents to see a motion picture or to see Superman, a weekly serial. If you went to the "show" with a quarter, you could have a coke, a small box of popcorn, and come home with change. People really didn't make a lot of money back in those days. But with food and movie prices being so low, you really didn't need to make a lot of money to have a decent life


### The Chagrin Falls Municipal Airport Dedication

The Chagrin Falls Airport was dedicated on July 10, 1932. 10,000 people attended the dedication and enjoyed the aerial demonstrations of daring deeds by famous flyers of the day. These flyers included Major James Doolittle, Major Alexander de Seversky, the Russian War Ace, Eddie Rickenbocker, "Casey" Jones, Barnstormer and a dozen other pilots. In all 28 different planes landed at the airport during the day. Albert Warren was the first mayor of the then , new South Russell Village. He had leased 74 acres of his farm on Bell Road for the airport just two weeks before the dedication day. Signers from Chagrin Falls for the lease of the land for ten years were J.C. Steel, mayor and Gladys M. Foster, Clerk. David S. Ingall, Naval war ace, candidate for governor of Ohio, gave the dedication speech. He said "It is a great tribute to the progressiveness of Chagrin Falls that your citizens are taking up this most modern form of transportation". The former airport land is now Kensington Green. 🐇
