SPRING SPORTS REVIEW

IT WAS A busy and successful spring for the Tiger athletes. The boys track and field team came in 4th place at CVC's, 3rd at districts, 7th at regionals, and 11th at the state meet. The

girls track and field team came in 2nd at the CVC meet, 3rd in the district meet and 4th at regionals. There were 11 total state qualifiers. Joe Bistritz '16 (Rich '77 & Martha Beattie Bistritz '77) capped his illustrious career with the all time division, state and stadium record in the mile with a 4:05.62 breaking the previous record of 4:07.12. The time was the 6th fastest in the nation this year. Joe would later finish 6th at the Adidas National Meet with a time of 4:06.70. The North Carolina State recruit received numerous honors including the News-Herald Boys Track & Field Athlete of the Year. In pole vault, Tessa Kostelec '17 competed on the women's side, while Victor Bello '16 represented Chagrin on the men's side. Natane Deruytter '16 finished her career in the 3,200 meter run. Michael Rose '16, Jackson Crandall '17, Paul Cantlay '18 (Doug '77 & Christine Youngberg Cantlay '85), and Joe Bistritz were 3rd in the 4 by 800 with a time of 8:00.02. Hailey Lowe '17, Catherine Coffey '19, Annie Zimmer '18, and Halle McClintock '17 won the state title in the 4 by 800 with a time of 9:16.75. The entire relay team will be returning next vear. The girls lacrosse team finished the season at 15-4 - 2 and lost to Columbus DeSales 10 - 7 in the state finals. This is the 4th straight year that they have made states. They were led led by All-Ohio players Ali Mazzola '17 and Camille Concannon '17. The boys lacrosse team ended the season with a record of 15-3. They were regional runners up, and lost in a very close regional championship game in overtime. Jackson Markley '16 was named All American for Boys Lacrosse (Lisa Howard Markley '83). Pierce Fricke '17 (Laura Wilharm Fricke '83) was named Academic All American for Boys Lacrosse. Jackson Markley and Garrett Bontempo '16 earned All-Ohio honors as well. The baseball team went 18-13 this season led by 1st Team All-Ohio player Tyler Zaluski '16. They came in second place in the CVC and were district champions. The team made it to regionals for the first time in 15 years and finished as regional runner ups. The softball team is in their second year back from not having a team and the numbers continued to climb with all players returning for next year. The boys tennis team finished in 4th place at the CVC tournament. They had a doubles team advance to districts and came very close to making states.

We also saw CFHS athletes earn honors in other sports. Besides competing at the state track and field meet in pole vault, **Victor Bello '16** performed in the Junior Olympic Nationals in Michigan. He competed in rings and vault and placed second on the vault, receiving a silver medal. **Allison Howell '18** has been selected to the U.S.A. Olympic Junior National Training program in curling. Golfer **Daniel Berlin** received the USGA-AJGA's Presidents Leadership Award. "The USGA-AJGA Presidents' Leadership Award was created to recognize one male and one female junior golfer who demonstrate leadership, character and community service through their involvement with the Leadership Links program – part of a larger joint initiative created by the USGA and AJGA in 2005 to further develop junior golfers through volunteerism." Daniel has raised more than \$4,000 for LifeAct, an organization dedicated to raising awareness for the warning signs of anxiety, depression and suicide. Daniel has also excelled in the classroom maintaining a 4.6 GPA, scored a perfect 36 on the ACT and is a successful pianist, going so far as playing at Carnegie Hall. On the links, he led the Tigers to a 3rd place finish at the state tournament and was individually the state runner-up. He returned to Columbus last year and will be looking to be on the podium again for his upcoming senior season.

A number of CFHS graduates took part in the 6th annual Senior Bowl in football. The White team was lead by Chagrin Head Coach Mark lammarino and included Chagrin players. **Michael Brigeman '16** threw two touchdowns at the end of the game, including one to **Tom Vandertill '16**, to lead the white team to victory, 41 - 40. **Brennan Izzo '16** (**Marabeth Smyser Izzo '85**) tied a FG record (2) and set a new extra point record (5) in the annual game. **Collin Morrell '16** also represented Chagrin in the victory.

Jeff Thompson '69, a member of the 2015 Chagrin Falls Schools Athletic Hall of Fame, was recently inducted into the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame West Shore Chapter. Jeff's CFHS athletic career was highlighted by being named to the Plain Dealer's Dream Team and leading the basketball team to the CVC title, the first of many for Head Coach Glenn Wyville. For this honor, Jeff was recognized for his 412 victories as a varsity head basketball coach that also included numerous conference titles and playoff victories and a state runner-up finish.

John Miller '72, a 2012 Chagrin Falls Schools Achievement Hall of Fame inductee, was recently featured by Interview magazine, the publication started by Andy Warhol. John is a conceptual artist known for his sculptures, photography, paintings and installed figures that typically cover the topics of identity, economics and social class. The Barnard professor has had his works exhibited around the world and are in permanent collections including the Whitney Museum of American Art, the Museum of Contemporary Art, Los Angeles, and Stedelijk Museum Amsterdam, among others. John is currently having his first comprehensive U.S. museum survey, which include more than 70 of his pieces, on view at the Institute of Contemporary Art, Miami. The exhibition is titled "John Miller: I Stand, I Fall,"

Austin Quinn '13 competed at the 2016 U.S. Olympic Swimming Trials in three different events. He clocked at 56.63 in the 100M Backstroke, which was 67th out of 183 swimmers. Austin's 1:51.64 in the 200 Meter Freestyle was 57th out of 183, while his 2:03.15 in the 200 Meter Individual Medley garnered a 26th out of 96 swimmers. Austin will be a senior this year at the University of Virginia and is considered the Cavaliers best middle distance swimmer. While at Chagrin, he was a seven-time high school All-American & state champion in 200 IM. Joining him this coming season will be younger brother Jason Quinn '16. Jason was a two-time state runner-up in the 500 Freestyle and two-time 3rd place finisher in the 200 IM. Both brothers were honored as the News-Herald Boys Swimmers of the Year in their senior seasons. 🐇

THERE WERE 705 students in grades 9 - 12 last year at Chagrin Falls.

Chagrin Falls High School has two administrators, one athletic director, 54 teaching faculty, three counselors, one psychologist and a librarian. Eightyseven percent of the staff hold advanced degrees including one doctorate.

The Speech & Debate Team had 75 members this past school year. 7 seniors competed at the state tournament, while 3 competed at the national tournament in Salt Lake City.

The Class of 2016 was the 128th graduating class of Chagrin Falls High School.

The members of the Class of 2016 had been accepted at 184 colleges and universities in the U.S., Canada, and the U.K. They will be attending 74 of these institutions located in 23 states and Canada.

The Cum Laude Society, which replaced the National Honor Society several years ago, inducted 32 seniors in 2016.

The Class of 2016 had 7 commended National Merit Qualifiers and 6 were National Merit Finalists.

Of the 168 graduating seniors in 2016 - 83 received a diploma with honors, 104 had a g.p.a. of 3.5 or higher and 43 had a 4.0 or higher

75% of the Class of 2016 took at least one Advanced Placement class. Overall, they took 664 AP exams. 84% of the exams taken resulted in scores of 3 or higher.

A Collaboration Classroom where we'll force collisions between students and faculty in small group discussions within the school, and beyond the borders of Chagrin Falls with connected technologies.
A Maker's Space to bring students' ideas to life with 3D printers, embroidery machines, laser cutters, tools and more, called the Fab Lab.
And finally other STEM, robotic and entrepreneurship programming district-wide.

We want to groom future researchers, collaborators and creators by providing the environment for this progressive approach to teaching and learning. The District's goal is to foster and develop the innovators of tomorrow.
