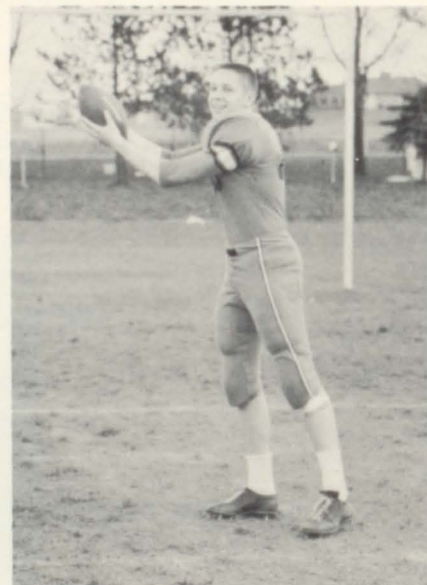


JIM FLETCHER

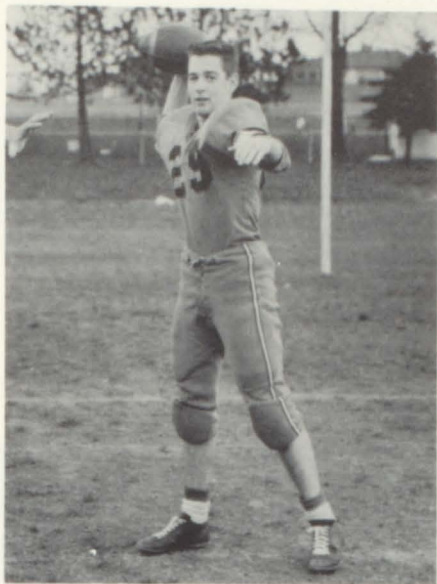
TOM CARLSON

Moved from halfback to end this year, Tom's excellent blocking and pass receiving made the Chagrin attack work effectively to the right side. It is his second varsity letter.

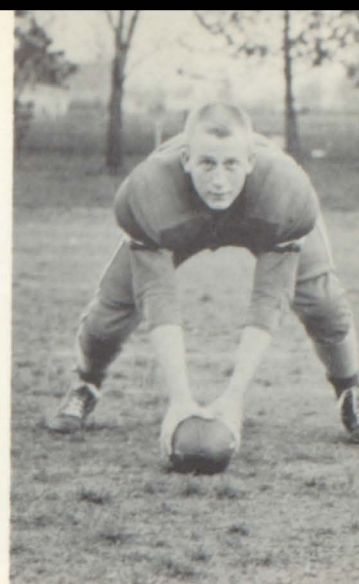


MARSHALL BARTON

Dick's spirit and determination sparked the Tigers through many rough spots during the season. A four year player with the Tigers, he was always ready to step in at the quarterback position.

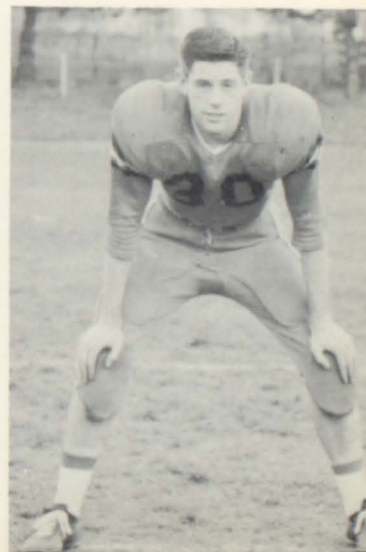

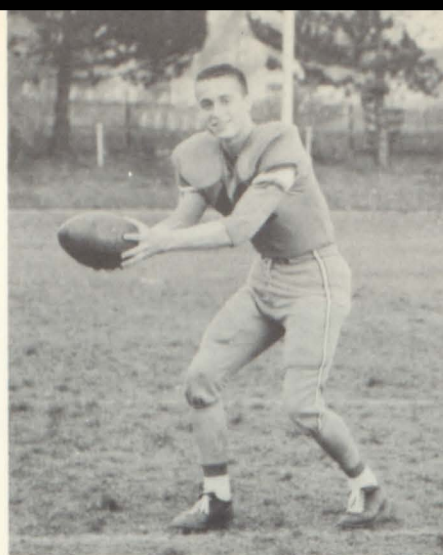


STEVE VAN NORT

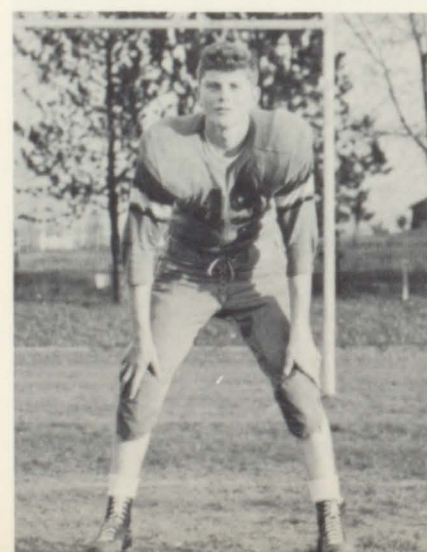


RONNIE ROOD

Bill's fine blocking from the left guard spot earned him a starting position in the Tigers' last few games. An aggressive competitor, he will be counted on heavily by next year's team.



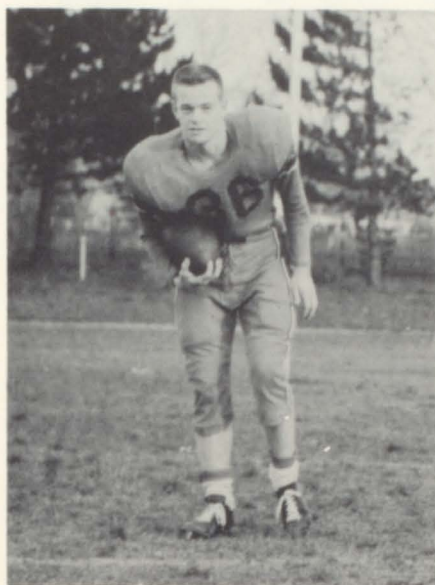

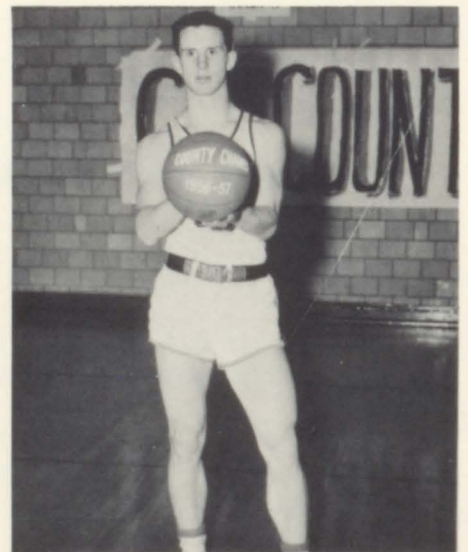


DAVE BANNING

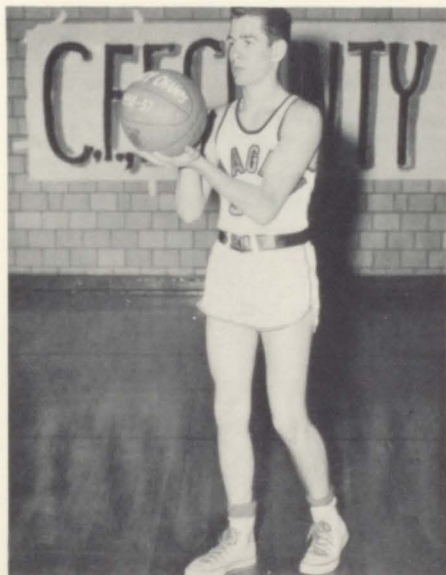


STEVE VAN NORT
