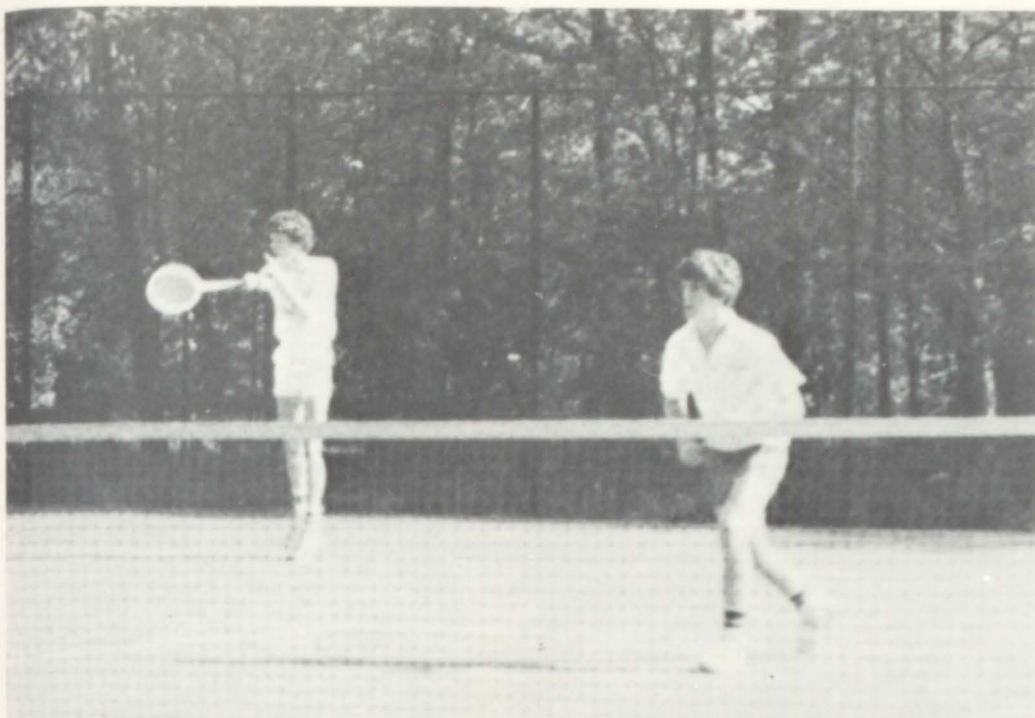

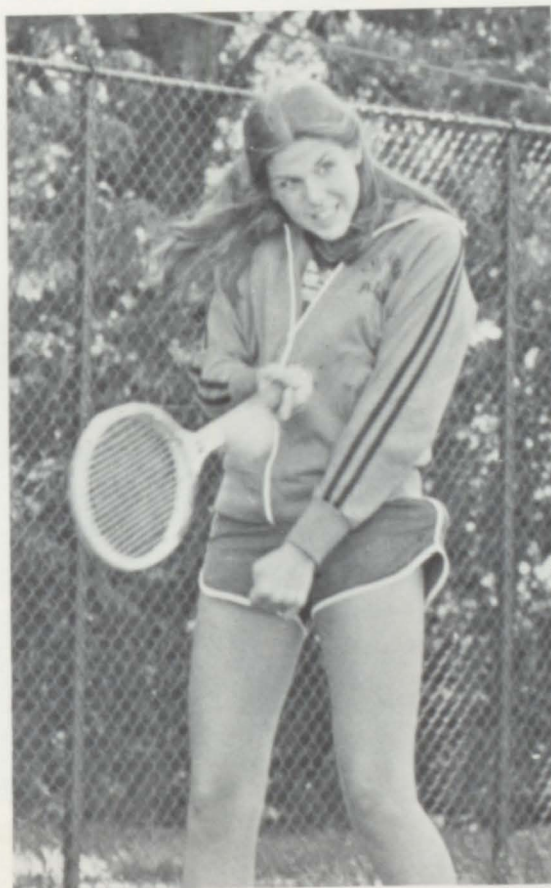

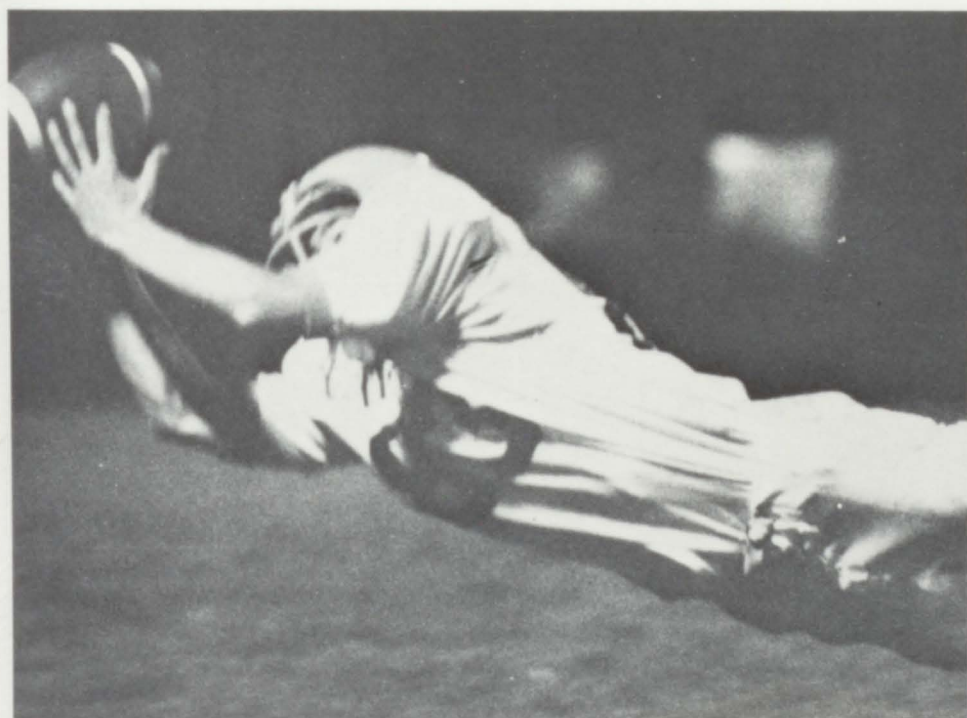

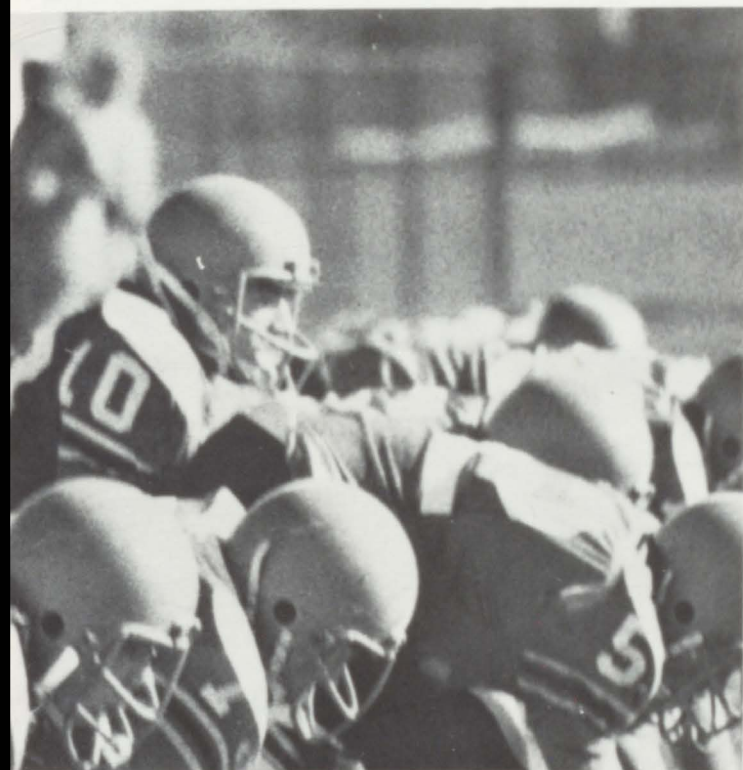

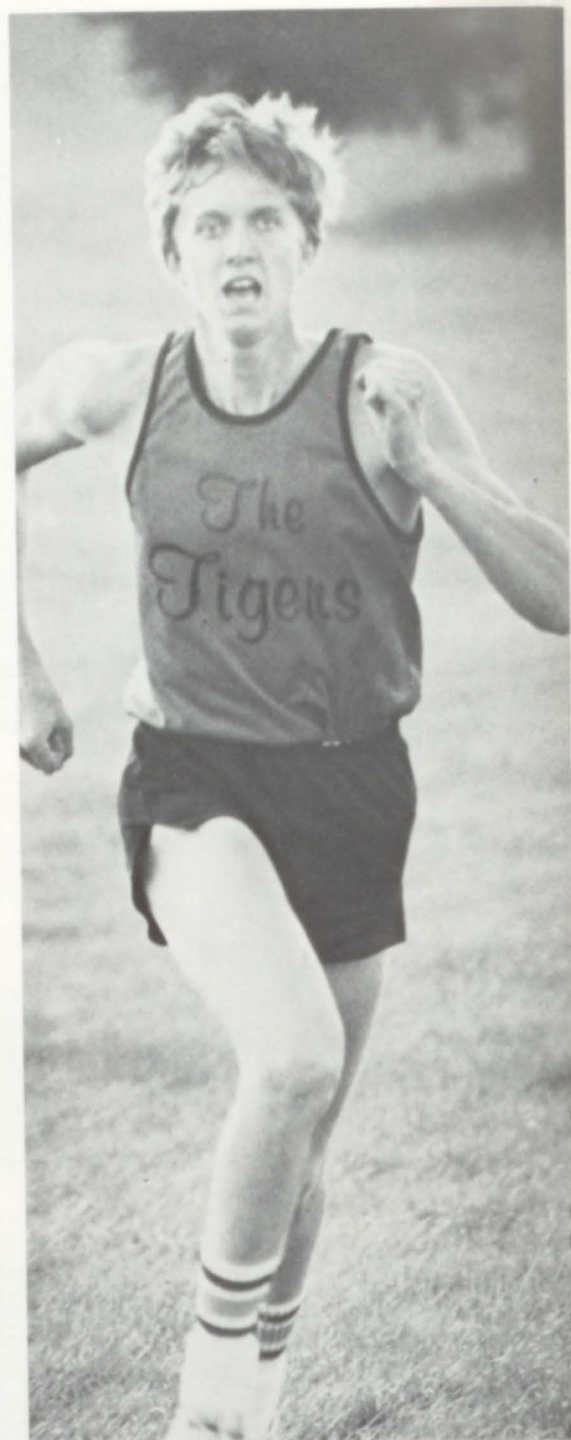

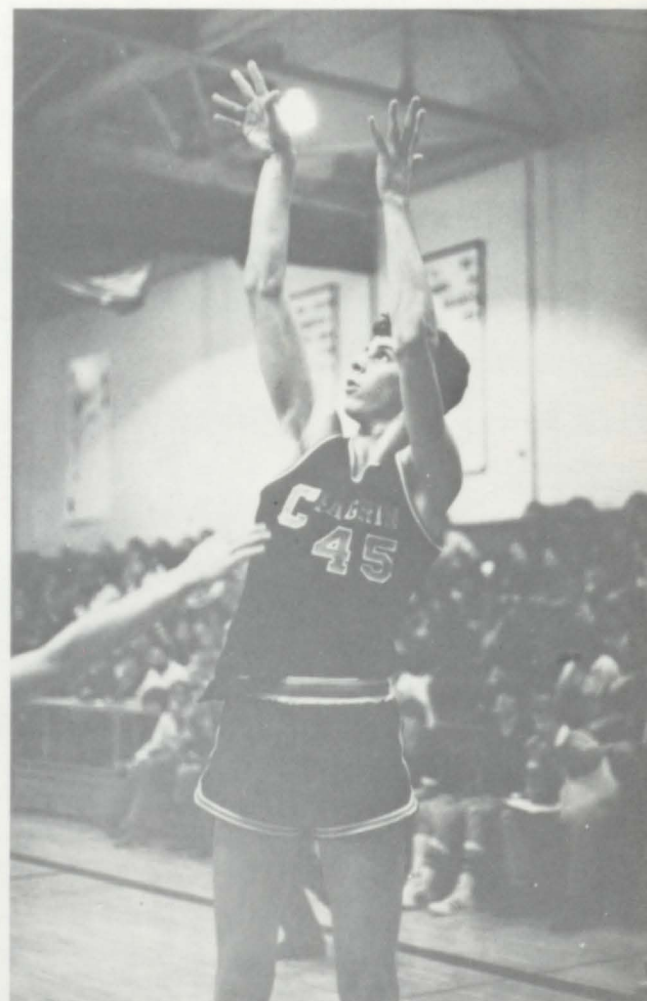

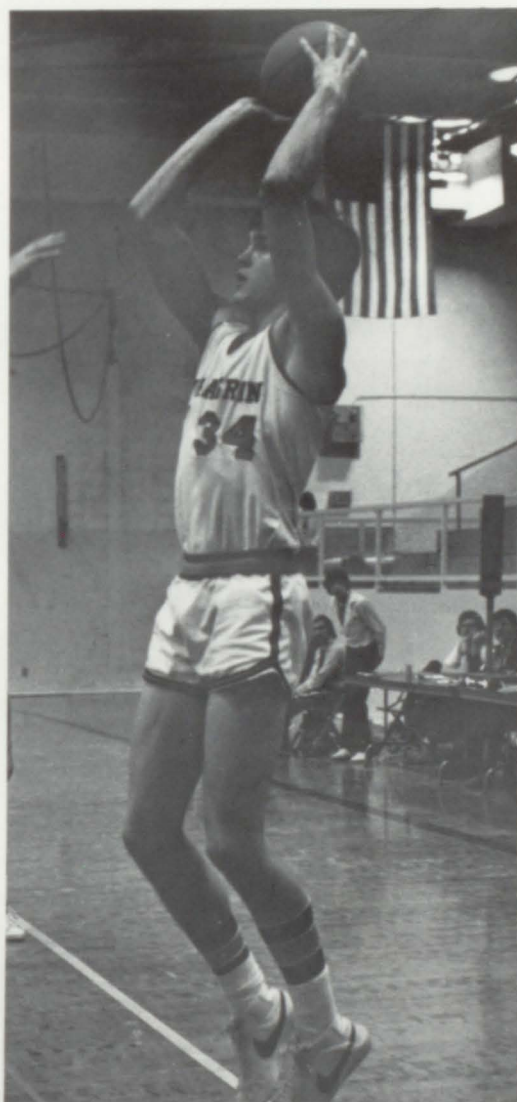

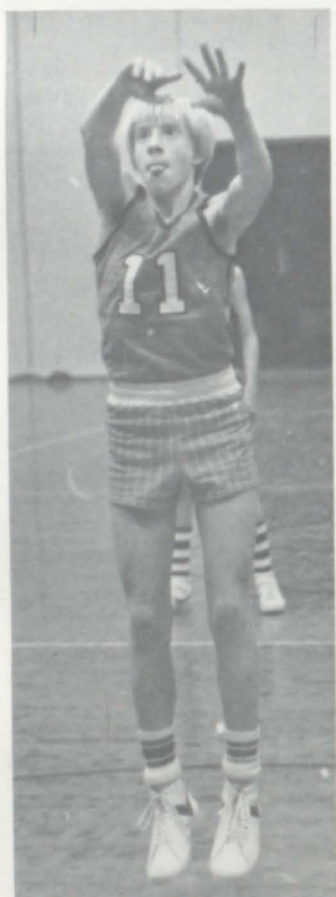

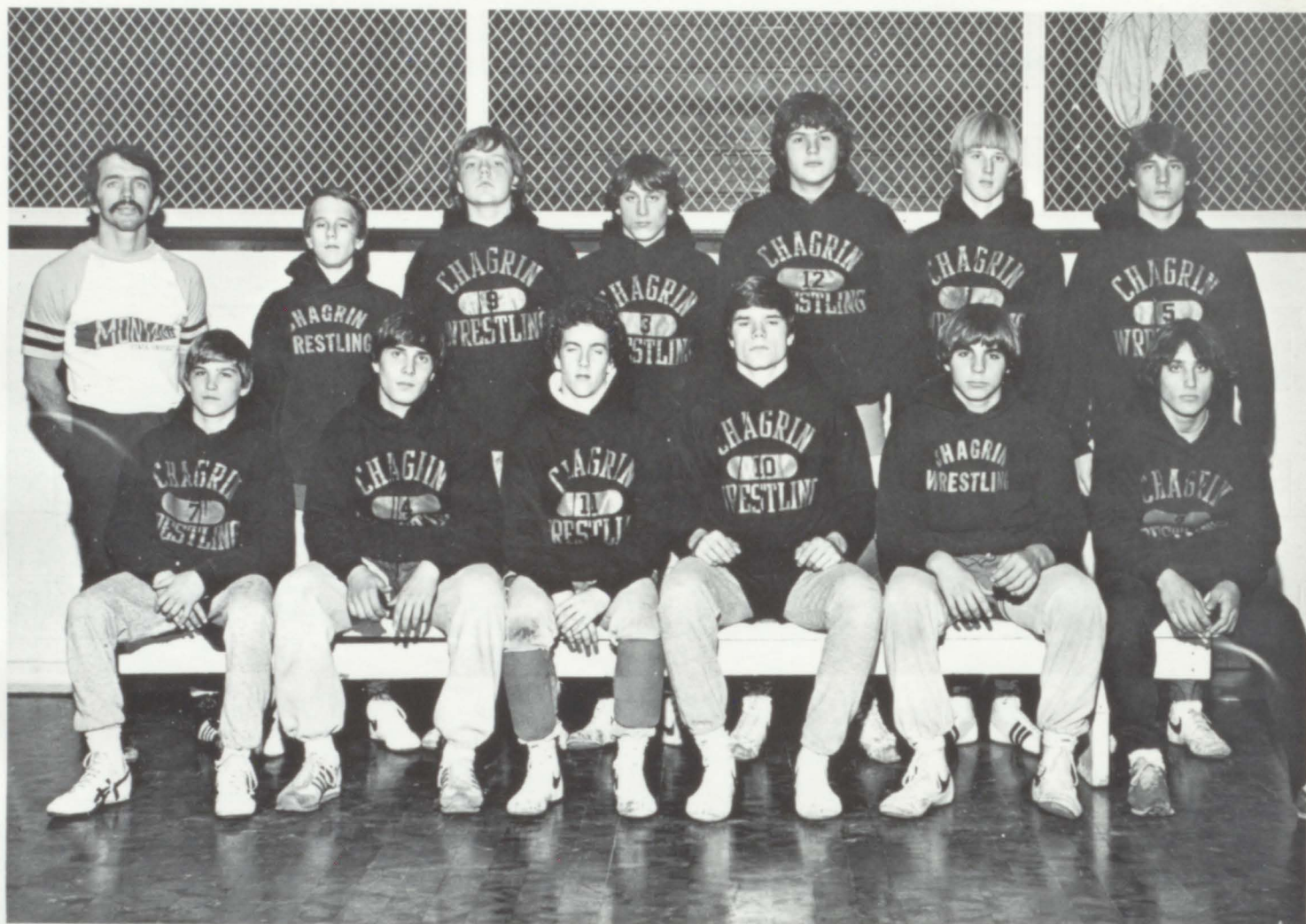

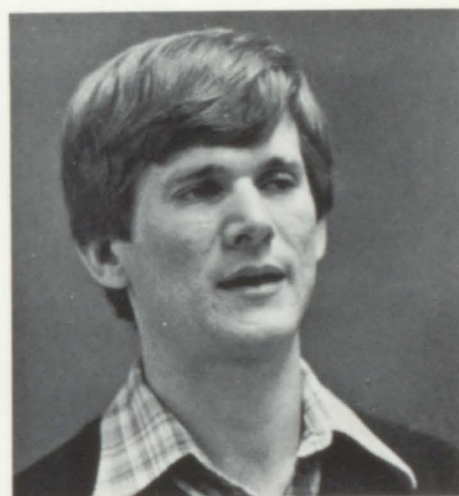

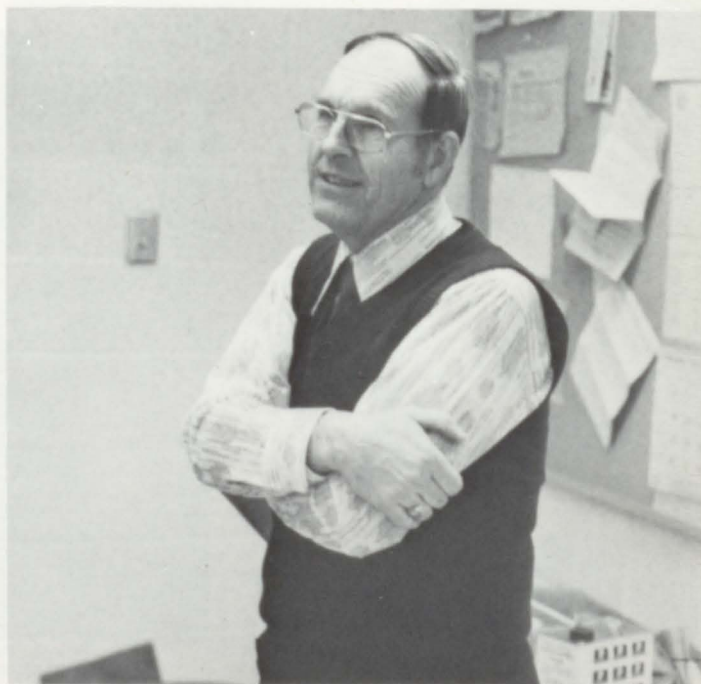

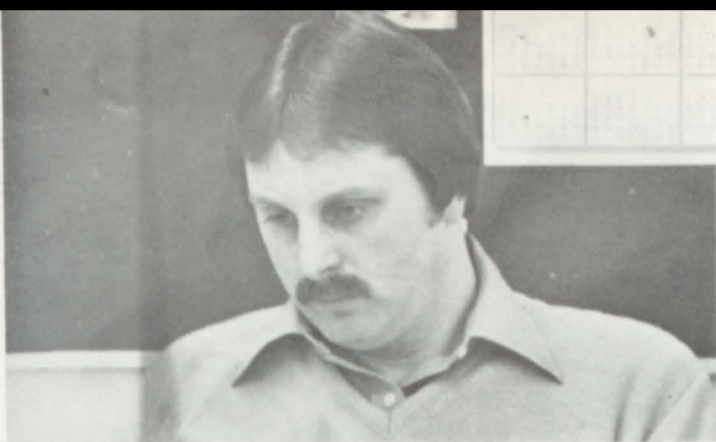

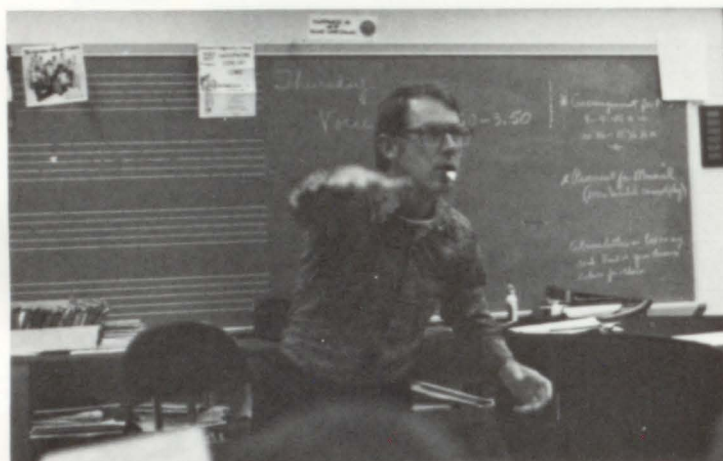
# Choir

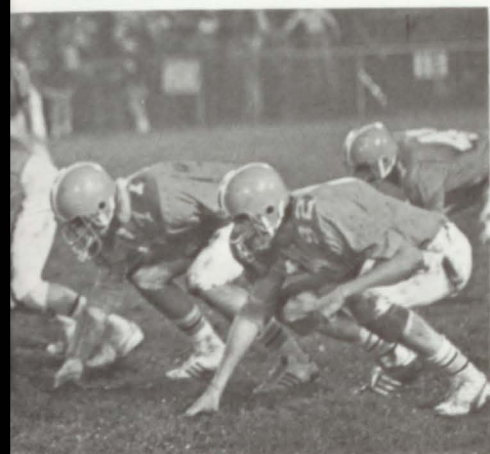


# HOMECOMING

## SENIORS 2-0

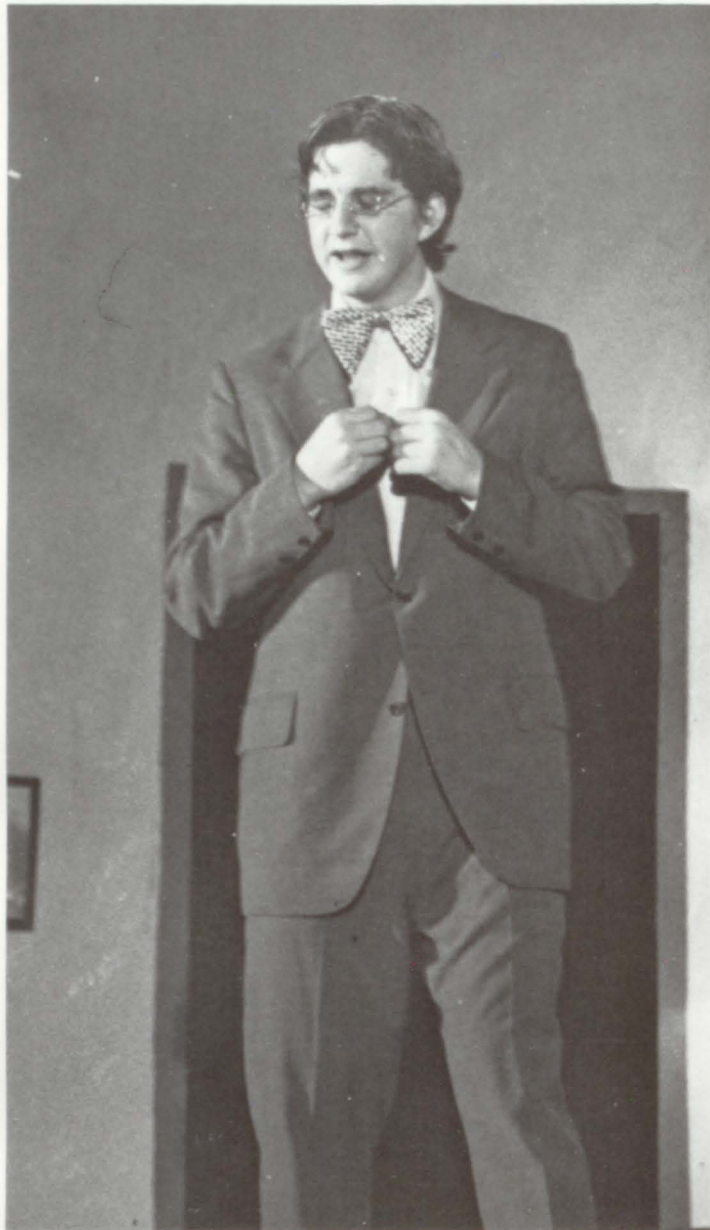
