Winter Athletic Season Wrap-Up

The winter was a busy athletic season for many of our tiger athletes. 11 of our athletes made 1st team all-conference, 17 were selected for 2nd team, while 13 were named Honorable Mention. We had 23 seniors make academic all conference.

On the team front, the hockey squad finished the season with a record of 14-9 and finished 3rd in the GCHSHL Blue North. The boys basketball team finished the season with a record of 12-11 and finished in 2nd place in the CVC. The girls basketball

team had a 12-12 record this year and came in 3rd place in the CVC. The wrestling team finished 6th place in the CVC. Our girls swim team came in 2nd place in the CVC, while the boys won the CVC.

Individually both the boys and girls swim teams qualified 5 swimmers for states in swimming. Samantha Holtz finished in 4th place in diving. Elizabeth Rankin, Anne Mills, Alexandra Scharpf, and Madi Machado placed 16th in the 200 Medley Relay. Alexandra Scharpf also finished in 20th in the 200 IM. Additionally, Madi Machado finished in 15th in the 100 back and 11th in the 100

Breast. The boys team finished in 11th place in the State. Max Mignogna, Zach Muckle, and Josh Rooney finished 9th in the 200 Medley Relay. Ben Broz, Mignogna, Muckle, and Munz earned 8th in the 200 Free Relay and 12th in the 400 Free Relay. Munz was also 9th in the 100 Fly. Additionally, Rooney was 10th in the 100 Back and 8th in the 200 IM. Sam Partain became the first wrestler to win districts in 24 years (Dave Roberts '98). Sam became the 13th state placer in Chagrin history, when he made the podium in 8th place at 150 lbs.

The emblem of CFHS was designed in 1914 by Reveley Beattie, Senior Class President. It was intended to serve various purposes: IN gold with numerals, it became the regular Senior class pin. As written in the 1914 Annual (precursor to the Zenith), a cheaper version would be made which might "be worn by any member of the high school who has passed, satisfactorily, the midyear examinations of the Freshman year."

A variety of information is available for NMSC to evaluate: The Finalist's academic record, information about the school's curriculum and grading system, PSAT/NMSQT Selection Index score, the high school official's written recommendation, information about the student's activities and leadership, and the Finalist's own essay.

Beginning in March and continuing to mid-June, NMSC notifies approximately 7,500 Finalists that they have been selected to receive a Merit Scholarship® award.

Betcha' Didn't Know

Dr. Mario Gerhardt is the winningest soccer coach in Ohio with 559 wins. With over 45 years as the Head Coach at Chagrin, he shared the sidelines with many assistant coaches. **Tad Taft '85** was with Coach Gerhardt the longest when he volunteered for 20 seasons. Middle School math teacher Geoff Brown spent the most day to day coaching during the tenure logging 14 seasons. There are many others that helped coach for the Tigers soccer team including **Larry Arnold '74** (11 seasons), Don Wem (11), **Jerry Preyss '70** (4), **Jim McSherry '73** (4), Bill Muzevich (4), Marty Dworak (4), Jim Howell (1), Dr. Bill Foley (1), **Matt Bifano '92** (1), **Tyler Exline '99** (1), & Todd Peltz (1). **Dan Ehrenbeit '67** helped on the sideline one preseason, which also included playing some goal for the team in the summer.

In 1849, when the Ohio legislature established a statewide education system, it decreed local boards of education. Therefore, a volunteer, self appointed Chagrin Falls Board of Education was formed. They had their first organizational meeting on May 25th. Stephen Smith was appointed president. The board had \$31.67 in its fund.

The Debate Club began in 1919, while Student Council began in 1925.

Hugh Christian was the first graduate from Chagrin Falls High School. He graduated in 1879 and was the only member of the class. The first woman to graduate was Ella Whitlock in 1882 and she, like Hugh, was the only graduate of her class year.

By 1892 there had been 38 CFHS graduates with twelve of them pursuing a college degree.

45 CF graduates served in World War 1. Many others from Chagrin also served, but either had dropped out of school to work or did not go on to high school after earning their 8th grade diploma.
